Synthetic Angled and Curved brushes with a sharp edge and a fine liner brush.

Synthetic Face Brushes (used for cream products):

Real Techniques and Zoeva have a great selection of face brushes that are similar to the one I showed in the video that are discontinued.

I haven't used any these myself, so I can't 100% say what they are like, but I wanted to give you some options that were like the ones I showed you.

- Real Techniques Light Layer Powder or Blusher Brush look similar to my Topshop Brush, good for foundation.
- Real Techniques Light Later Complexion or Custom Complexion Brush - look similar to my original contour brush by Real Techniques, good for cream bronzer/contour (I saw the best selection of Real Techniques on www.littlewoodsireland.ie)

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- Zoeva 102 or 110 short rounded and dense, looks similar to my RT Original Contour Brush, good for cream bronzer/contour – www.beautybay.com
- Zoeva 126 flat but soft and fluffy. good for foundation or cream contour – www.beautybay.com
- Paddy McGurgan No 16 Pro Medium Foundation Brush looks very similar to my Blank Canvas one, good for foundation or cream contour - www.makeupprostore.co.uk (use code JEANETTE10)
- Crown C522 flat but soft and fluffy with an angled tip, good for foundation or cream contour - www.crownbrush.co.uk
- Crown C404 small stippling brush, good to sheer out coverage, apply primers or sheer foundation, cream contour etc www.crownbrush.co.uk
